



#### Number of UAC in Reception and Identification Centers/Protective Custody 30 November 2019 – 31 August 2020



Additionally, **1031** UAC (<u>39 of which pending transfer</u>) have been reported as living in informal/insecure housing conditions such as living temporarily in apartments with others, living in squats, being homeless and moving frequently between different types of accommodation.

The above number includes 36 UAC with no location reported by the referral agent. EKKA is in the process of updating this information.

### **UAC** shelters

- Current: 59 UAC shelters with total 1599 places

# SIL (Supported Independent Living) apartments

- Current: 46 SIL apartments for UAC older than 16 years old with total 184 places
- Planned: 19 SIL apartments with total 76 places

### Safe zones\*

Current: 13 Safe Zones for UAC with total 390 places

# Hotels\*\* and emergency accommodation sites (E.A.S.)


- Current: 8 Hotels for UAC with total 395 places (1 acts as a transit hub for UAC relocation)
- Current: 1 E.A.S. for UAC with total 30 places

\*Safe Zones are designated supervised spaces within accommodation sites which provide UAC with 24/7 emergency protection and care. They should be used as short term (maximum 3 months) measures to care for UAC in light of the insufficient number of available shelter places. Safe Zone priority is given to UAC in detention as well as other vulnerable children, in line with their best interests.

\*\*Hotels are emergency accommodation spaces being used as a measure to care for UAC in light of the insufficient number of available shelter places. Priority is given to UAC in Reception and Identification Centers.







