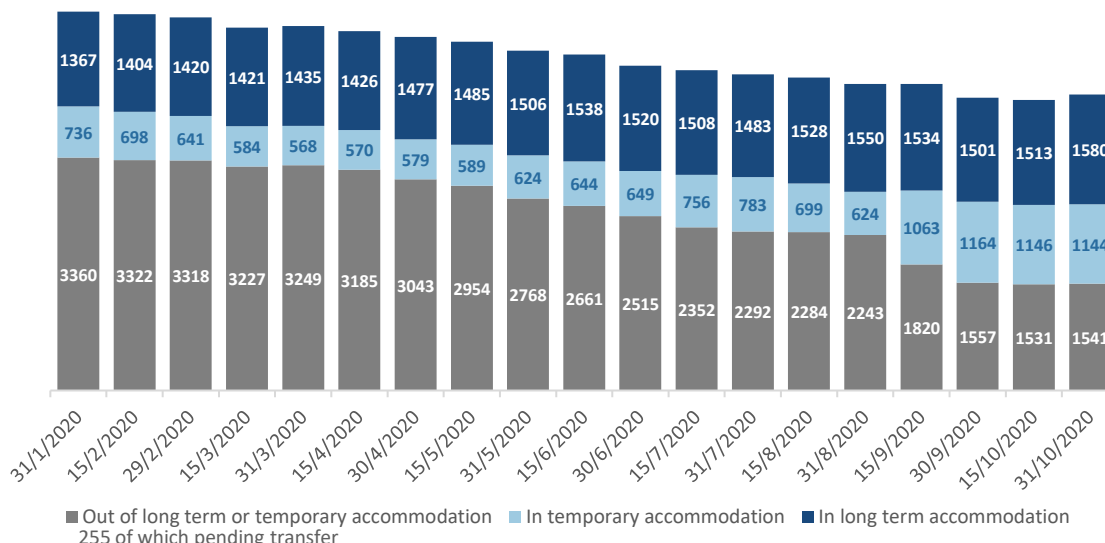

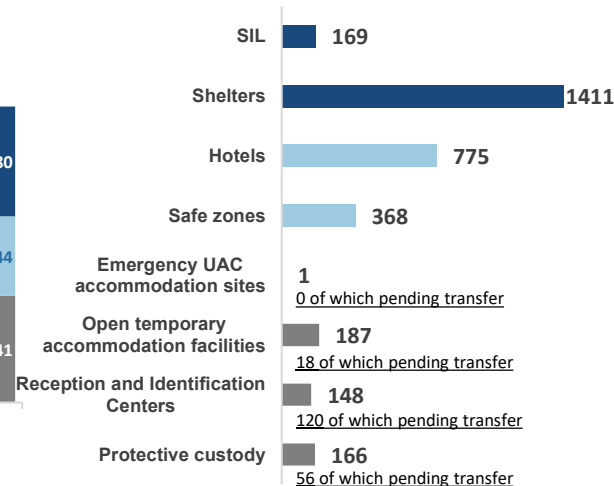

31 January 2020 – 31 October 2020

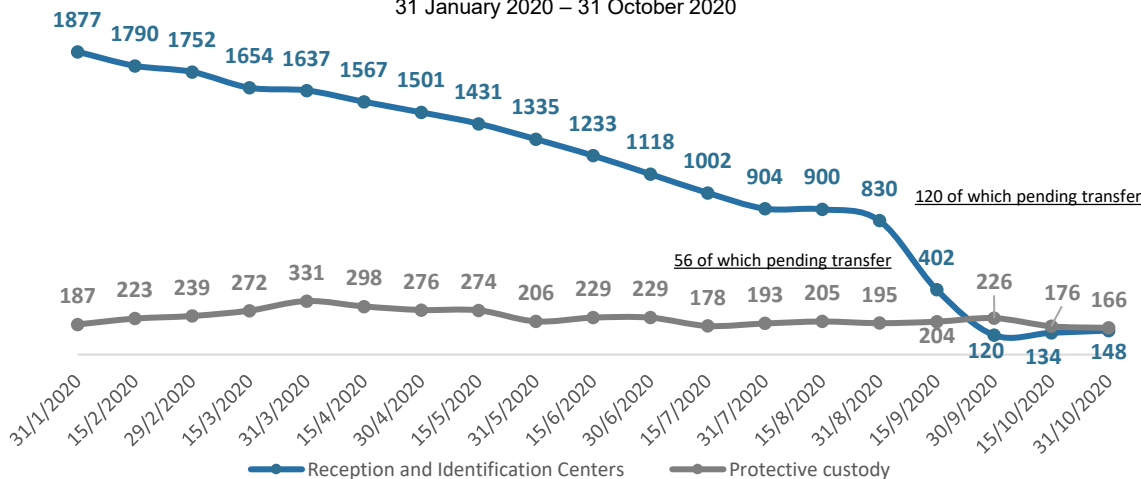


UAC analysis per accommodation type

Additionally, **1028** UAC (**61** of which pending transfer) have been reported as living in informal/insecure housing conditions such as living temporarily in apartments with others, living in squats, being homeless and moving frequently between different types of accommodation.

The above number includes 30 UAC with no location reported by the referral agent. EKKA is in the process of updating this information.

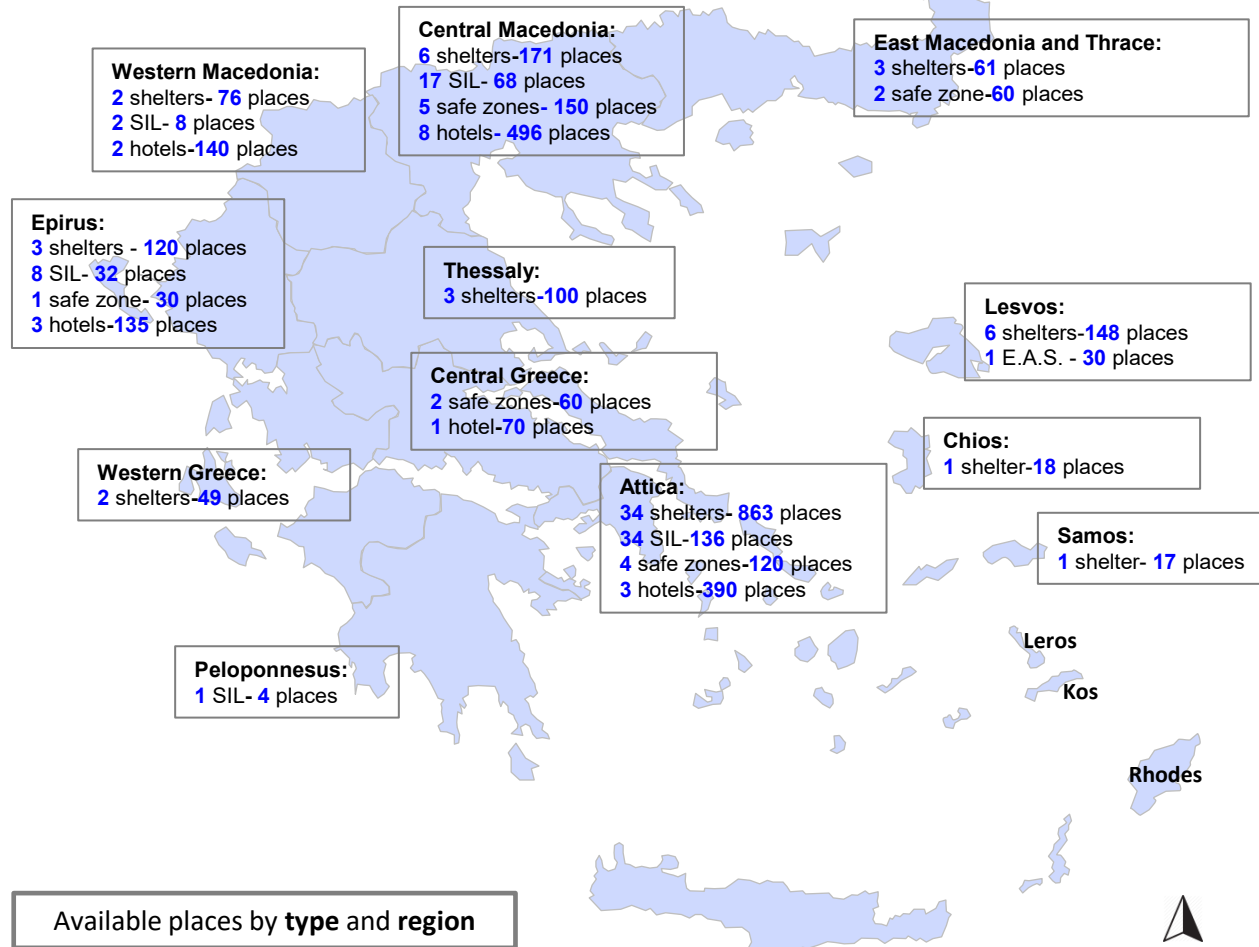
- **Current: 14** Safe Zones for UAC with total **420** places

Hotels** and emergency accommodation sites (E.A.S.)

- **Current: 17** Hotels for UAC with total **1231** places (1 acts as a transit hub for UAC relocation)
 - **Current: 1** E.A.S. for UAC with total **30** places

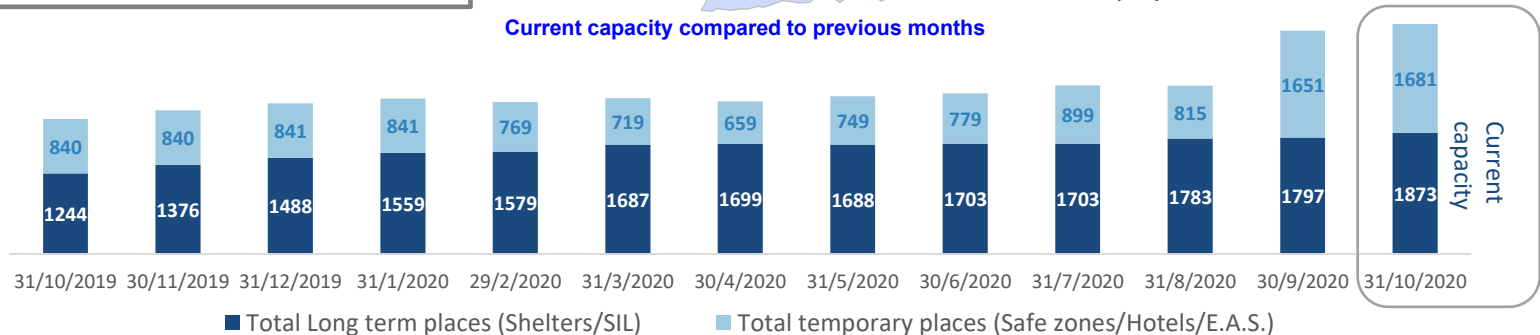
***Safe Zones** are designated supervised spaces within accommodation sites which provide UAC with 24/7 emergency protection and care. They should be used as short term (maximum 3 months) measures to care for UAC in light of the insufficient number of available shelter places. Safe Zone priority is given to UAC in detention as well as other vulnerable children, in line with their best interests.

****Hotels** are emergency accommodation spaces being used as a measure to care for UAC in light of the insufficient number of available shelter places. Priority is given to UAC in Reception and Identification Centers.

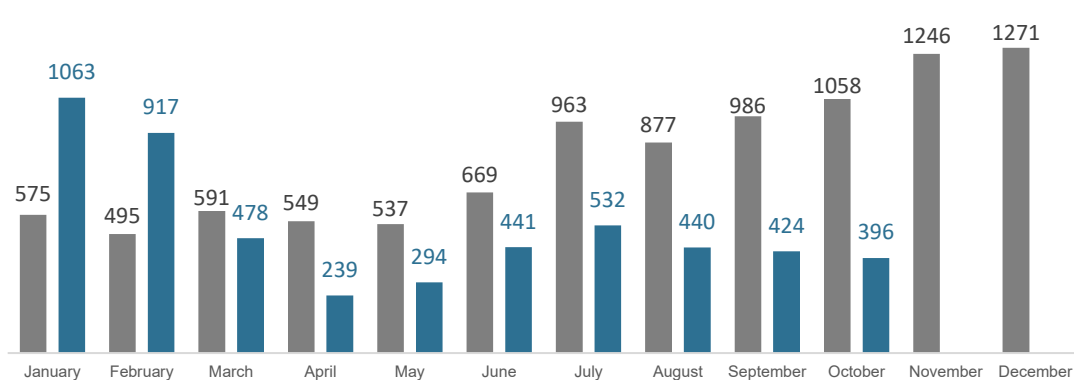

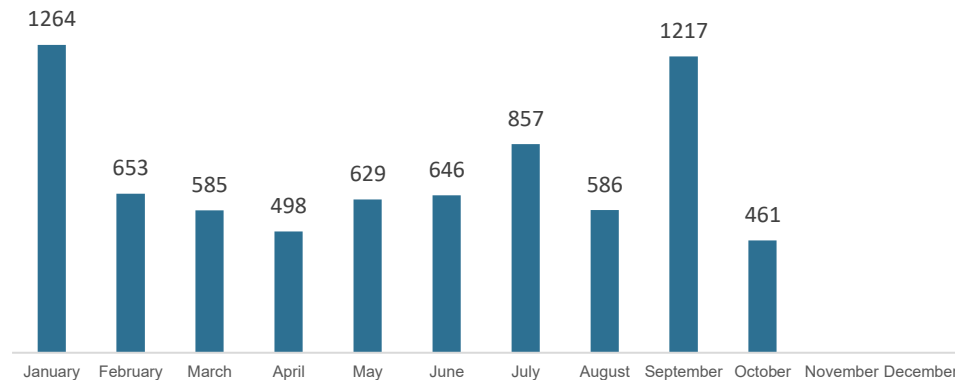
Number of UAC Referrals to EKKΑ by month

■ 2019 ■ 2020



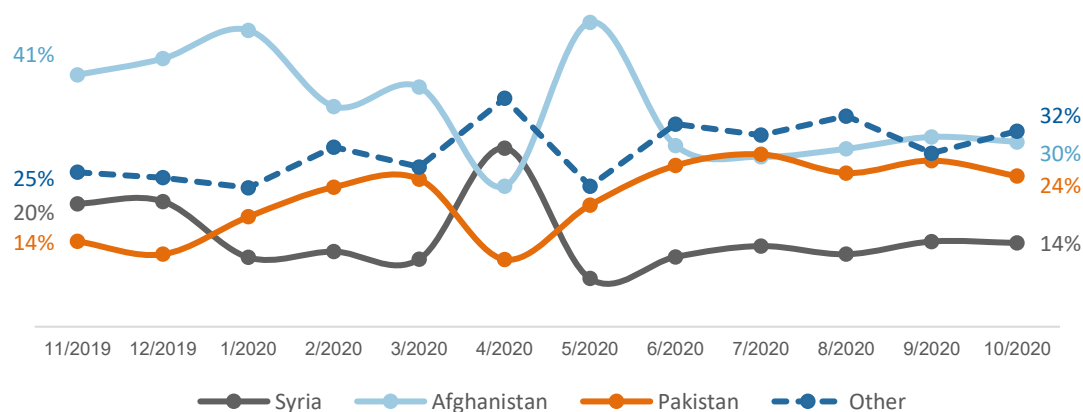

(updated on a monthly basis)

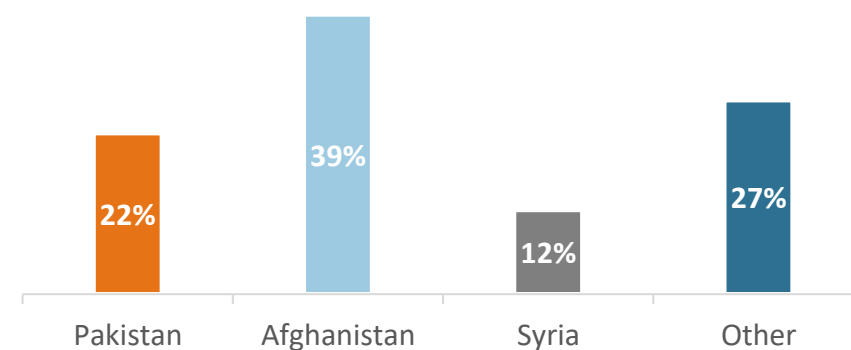
